JONESVILLE COUNCIL RECOGNIZES BOYLE

The Jonesville City Council recognized Wastewater Treatment Plant Superintendent Brian Boyle for more than 40 years of service to the citizens of Jonesville at their meeting on Wednesday night. Boyle has announced his retirement from the position at the end of the month.

Mayor Gerry Arno presented Boyle with a proclamation from the City Council that noted that he has served in every position at the Plant. "Your conduct and service have been an example to others and garnered the respect of your peers in this City and in the water and wastewater industry," Arno said.

Former Wastewater Treatment Plant Superintendent Rick Mahoney shared stories of his time working with Boyle. He noted his years in the industry and called Brian, "one of the best" he had worked with.

In accepting the proclamation, Boyle reflected on his time working at the Plant with Mahoney and others. "We've had more fun at a job than we should have," he said. He thanked the Council for supporting the staff over the years, allowing them to be successful in serving the community well.

Later in the meeting agenda, the City Council approved the recommendation from City Manager Jeff Gray to name current Assistant Superintendent Ed Hughes as Interim Superintendent.
