6. A. Resolution 2016-01 – Meetings of the Board of Review

[ROLL CALL] [Action Item]

The attached resolution would establish the meeting dates and times for the Board of Review, to occur in City Hall during the first and third weeks of March on the days and times noted. I recommend approval of the resolution. A roll call vote is required. *Please refer to the attached Resolution 2016-01*.

6. B. Award Bid - Jonesville Rail Trail Construction

[Action Item]

Sealed bids were opened from eight bidders on the morning of Thursday, February 11<sup>th</sup>. Our design engineer, the Spicer Group, is currently reviewing the bids received to assure that they are complete and follow the specifications. In addition, some bidders proposed some volunteer bid alternates aimed at reducing the cost of the project. On initial review, it appears that Parrish Construction out of Quincy is the low bidder. Once Spicer has completed its review of the bids, they will compile a complete bid tabulation and recommendation, including action on any appropriate bid alternates. I expect to have that information prior to the meeting on Wednesday for Council's action. While I would not ordinarily place an item on the agenda without information, I appreciate your patience as we review the higher than expected number of bids. We obviously are interested in acting at this time to assure that the project can stay on schedule for a spring construction.

6. C. Resolution 2016-02 – Jonesville Rail Trail Maintenance

[ROLL CALL] [Action Item]

A portion of the Rail Trail will be built in the Beck Street right-of-way. Beck Street is under the jurisdiction of the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT). As a condition of issuing a permit to allow construction of the pathway, MDOT requires that we approve a resolution to state that the City will maintain the pathway in their right-of-way. I recommend approval of the attached resolution, which is based on a template provided by MDOT. A roll call vote is required. *Please refer to the attached Resolution 2016-02*.

6. D. Affirm Election Commission Appointments

[Action Item]

In 2014, Council appointed Clerk Cindy Means, Finance Director Lenore Spahr, and City Manager Jeff Gray to serve on the Election Commission, pursuant to Section 4.13 of the City Charter. The Commission appoints Election Inspectors and prescribes election procedure where there is doubt about procedure. It is recommended that Council affirm that the appointments will continue for the March and August primary elections and the November general election in 2016. A motion is necessary to approve the appointments.

6. E. Planning Commission 2016 Work Plan

The Planning Commission has approved the attached work plan for 2016. A priority task is the 5-year review and update of the Master Land Use Plan. The Commission also intends to support implementation of the Recreation Master Plan, and coordination of its activities with other City boards and commissions. # Jonesville Rail Trail - Proposed Maintenance Plan (Attachment to Resolution 2016-02)

The City of Jonesville will be responsible for the maintenance of the 1.4 mile non-motorized pathway, along the abandoned North-South Railway corridor in the City, a portion of the Beck Street right-of-way (ROW) and Gaige Street ROW, as depicted on the plans prepared by the Spicer Group dated January, 2016 (Project No. 121243SG2014), also known as the Jonesville Rail Trail. Operation and maintenance shall include the portion of the non-motorized pathway located within the MDOT ROW of Beck Street in accordance with the following.

The City will perform routine maintenance duties by City of Jonesville DPW staff or qualified contractors, hired by the City of Jonesville.

### Maintenance Activities to Include:

- Periodic inspection of the concrete and asphalt surfaces
- Ensure ADA compliance, note cracks and prioritize needed repairs to concrete and asphalt surfaces
- Periodically inspect railroad safety markings
- Brush/clean significant snow or ice accumulation
- Graffiti removal, as needed

### **OPERATION & MAINTENANCE**

The plant was in compliance with the NPDES permit limitations during the month of December 2015.

Performed lagoon analysis for Camden and Merry Lake.

Gen Power was on site to perform semi-annual maintenance on the generators at the water plant and the wastewater plant.

A new electric heater was installed in the chemical room at the water plant. Plant staff can easily remove the heater during the warmer months to lengthen the life of the heater. The fumes from the chemicals in the room will deteriorate metal surfaces.

All lab equipment was calibrated and certified. This is a program that we began last year in order to ensure quality lab results.

Completed and submitted a capital improvement plan for the water system to the MDEQ.

A water line on the trickling filter tower was repaired.
