Park Usage Policy

Organizations, Groups, or Families (for reunion purposes) who desire to use or reserve a portion of G. Carl Fast Park or Wright Street Park for an organized function, must apply for a permit at the Jonesville Village Office. The parks are available for organized group activities on a first come first serve basis. Applicants must state the date & time of park usage and provide a brief, but detailed description of the activities that will take place by the reserving group or organization.

All groups, families, and other organizations that seek a permit under this policy must strictly adhere to the following regulations:

- No alcoholic beverages or non-prescription drugs are allowed in any of the Village parks.
- 2. No stakes or posts shall be allowed to be placed or inserted upon or within park property without prior consent of the Department of Public Works.
- 3. Prior permission must be received for use of electrical outlets in either park.
- 4. Applicants must receive permission prior to using any type of vehicles in either park.
- 5. Music events shall be permitted in the parks between the hours of 12:00P.M. and 7:00 P.M. Loudspeakers must be kept at a minimum low volume.
 - 6. Hours are posted in each park and must be adhered to.
 - 7. Organizations, Groups and Families that have within their membership, City residents may use the restroom facilities in the Wright Street Park, but must apply for, and pick up key at the City Office. Non-resident Organizations, Groups and families will be charged a \$50 security deposit which will be returned after satisfactory inspection of the facilities by the Department of Public Works. Those who secure the key are responsible for damages and will be assessed accordingly.
 - 8. The name of the sponsoring organization or group that reserves a park under this policy shall be displayed prominently at the function as well as names and telephone numbers of the officers of such organization.
 - 9. All trash used for the event must be removed from the park. Please bring your own garbage bags, none will be provided.



NON-MOTORIZED PATH MAINTENANCE

THIS CONTRACT is made and entered into this date of May 3, 2016, by and between the MICHIGAN DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, hereinafter referred to as the "DEPARTMENT"; and the CITY OF JONESVILLE, Michigan, hereinafter referred to as the "AGENCY"; for the purpose of fixing the rights and obligations of the parties in agreeing to the maintenance and operation of a non-motorized facility to be constructed in the AGENCY, by the AGENCY, along Highway Old M-99 (Beck Road) and across MDOT railroad right-of-way, operated by the Indiana Northwestern Railroad.

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the AGENCY is proposing the construction of a non-motorized facility along portions of Highway Old M-99 (Beck Road) and MDOT railroad right-of-way which will be constructed independent of the trunkline roadway; and

WHEREAS, the DEPARTMENT has determined it to be acceptable to have the AGENCY construct the non-motorized facility, hereinafter referred to as the "PROJECT" and further described and located as follows:

Construction of a non-motorized facility along Highway Old M-99 (Beck Road) from M-99 to Gaige Street and across MDOT railroad right-of-way; together with necessary related work, located within the corporate limits of the AGENCY; and

WHEREAS, the AGENCY will be responsible for the entire cost of the PROJECT; and

WHEREAS, the PROJECT at the railroad crossing will be built and maintained as specified in the Diagnostic Study Team Review Report (DSRT) as shown on EXHIBIT "A", dated October 13, 2014, attached hereto and made a part hereof, (consisting of pages 1 through 11); and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto have reached an understanding with each other regarding the performance of the PROJECT work and the maintenance and operation of the facility to be constructed as the PROJECT and desire to set forth this understanding in the form of a written contract.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual undertakings of the parties and in conformity with applicable law, it is agreed:

1. The AGENCY will construct the PROJECT at no cost to the DEPARTMENT.

- 2. The AGENCY shall cause to be performed all the PROJECT work. It is understood that portions or all of the PROJECT work will be placed under contract by the AGENCY. The performance of the PROJECT work will be subject to the following conditions:
 - A. The AGENCY will hire a contractor to perform the contracted portions of the PROJECT work.
 - B. The AGENCY will design, or cause to be designed, the PROJECT, and shall accept full responsibility for that design. Any review undertaken by the DEPARTMENT shall not relieve the AGENCY of its obligation hereunder.
 - C. All work in connection with the PROJECT shall be performed in conformance with the DEPARTMENT'S current Standard Specifications for Construction, special provisions, and the supplemental specifications and plans pertaining to the PROJECT. All materials furnished and used in construction of the PROJECT shall conform to the aforesaid specifications.

The PROJECT work shall be performed in accordance with plans and specifications reviewed by the DEPARTMENT. No changes will be made to the plans and specifications reviewed by the DEPARTMENT which affect the PROJECT without the same being re-reviewed by the DEPARTMENT.

The DEPARTMENT'S review does not relieve the AGENCY of meeting any applicable requirements of law or of other public bodies or agencies with respect to the design, construction, or operation of the PROJECT.

- D. The AGENCY will comply with all applicable State, Federal and local statutes, ordinances and regulations, and obtain all permits that are required for the performance of the PROJECT work.
- E. The AGENCY shall provide all construction engineering and inspection necessary for the PROJECT; however, the DEPARTMENT may, at its own expense, provide a competent inspector, together with necessary assistance, to assist the field representative of the AGENCY in completing the PROJECT. Said inspector of the DEPARTMENT, acting through the AGENCY'S engineer, shall have the right to reject any or all portions of the work which are not executed pursuant to the plans and specifications.
- F. Prior to the performance of any PROJECT work, the AGENCY shall notify the Jackson TSC Manager, Michigan Department of Transportation and the Michigan Department of Transportation Office of Rail at the

following locations when the work will commence so arrangements may be made, if necessary, to have an inspector present while the work is in progress.

The AGENCY shall require their contractor to provide standard Owner's Protective Public Liability and Owner's Protective Property Damage Liability Insurance with respect to the operations of its contractors or their subcontractors during the performance of the PROJECT work, naming the Michigan State Transportation Commission, the State of Michigan and the DEPARTMENT and its employees as insureds. The policy shall state that the DEPARTMENT must be given thirty (30) days written notice before said insurance is altered or cancelled.
 - (1) Standard Owner's Protective Public Liability Insurance providing for limits of liability of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) for each occurrence with an aggregate of Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) for the terms of the policy with respect to bodily injury or death.
 - (2) Standard Owner's Protective Property Damage Liability Insurance providing for limits of liability of not less than One Million Dollars (\$1,000,000) for each occurrence with an aggregate of Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000) for the terms of the policy with respect to property damage and physical damage to property.
 - (3) Evidence of the above insurances is to be sent to the DEPARTMENT at the following address, prior to performance of the PROJECT work.

- H. The AGENCY shall secure a permit from the DEPARTMENT for the PROJECT work and shall conform with all DEPARTMENT permit requirements for any work to be performed on the state trunkline and railroad right-of-way.
- I. The AGENCY shall require their contractor to provide a Lien and Performance Bond for work on state trunkline right-of-way in accordance with existing law.
- 3. The AGENCY hereby agrees that immediately upon execution of this contract, it will:
 - A. Enact, and keep in full force and effect, such ordinances or regulations as may be necessary to assure that no motorized vehicles (except those for maintenance purposes, and, where snow conditions and state and local regulations permit, snowmobiles) shall be permitted on the facility being constructed as the PROJECT.
 - B. Determine if any existing ordinances restrict use of the facility by bicycles, and, if so, that it will amend such ordinances and keep it in full force and effect to allow use by bicycles.
 - C. Enact no ordinance which prohibits the use of bicycles on the facility constructed as the PROJECT.

- D. Enforce Act 300 P.A. 1949 (MCLA 257.660) with respect to bicycles on the roadway portion of highway.
- 4. The AGENCY shall NOT BE REQUIRED TO PAY a Real Estate fee for use of state-owned right-of-way.

The AGENCY agrees not to rent or sublease the facility. The AGENCY shall be responsible for all services commonly known and designated as public utilities and the securing of deposits and payments for all such obligations. The AGENCY must provide continuous liability insurance for said in the amount of \$500,000.00 with the DEPARTMENT named as additional insured. The parties mutually agree that this contract is subject to the provisions of Public Act 189 of 1953 as amended (users of Tax-Exempt Property).

- 5. Upon completion of construction, the AGENCY will, at its sole cost and expense, inspect, maintain and operate the facility constructed as the PROJECT as a non-motorized facility. Per MCL 462.309, the railroad will be responsible for all costs of grade crossing surface maintenance and replacement between the rails and for a distance outside the rails of one foot beyond the end of the ties, after initial installation. The AGENCY shall conform with all DEPARTMENT permit requirements for any work to be performed within the state trunkline and railroad right-of-way. As-built plans will be provided to the Jackson TSC Office and to the MDOT Office of Rail.
 - A. It is understood if the AGENCY sells, leases, or abandons the AGENCY-owned property containing non-motorized pedestrian facility on the north end of PROJECT location, it shall also be responsible for removing non-motorized pedestrian facility in DEPARTMENT-owned PROJECT location and restoring to original condition at no cost to the DEPARTMENT. The AGENGY shall also be responsible for reuniting limited access right-of-way fences, if applicable.
 - B. The AGENCY agrees that the PROJECT location will be maintained so as to assure that any trunkline and railroad facilities, structures and the area within the trunkline and railroad right-of-way boundaries will be kept in good condition, both as to safety and appearance, and that maintenance of the facilities by the AGENCY will be accomplished in a manner so as not to cause interference with the reconstruction, maintenance or operation of the trunkline and railroad facility and right-of-way. The AGENCY will obtain a permit from the DEPARTMENT for any future maintenance work within the trunkline or railroad right-of-way.
 - C. The DEPARTMENT reserves the right to enter the PROJECT location for the purpose of inspection, maintenance or reconstruction of the trunkline and railroad facility when necessary. Additionally, the DEPARTMENT reserves the right to access the PROJECT location as deemed necessary

for inspection relating to the DEPARTMENT'S interests. Such inspections are made for the DEPARTMENT'S own purposes and shall not relieve the AGENCY of its duties and obligations under the terms of this contract. Any deficiencies discovered will be corrected or repaired by the AGENCY at no cost to the DEPARTMENT.

- D. Prior to occupancy and/or use of the PROJECT location, the DEPARTMENT will inspect and approve the construction of the PROJECT.
- E. The AGENCY shall be responsible for ensuring the safety and security of the users of the PROJECT location, and to maintain the PROJECT location in a safe operating condition.
- 6. The parties hereto agree to comply with all applicable requirements of the Natural Resources and Environmental Protection Act, 1994 P.A., 451, MCL 324.01 et. Seq. for all PROJECT work performed under this contract and future maintenance work, and the AGENCY shall require its contractors and subcontractors to comply with the same.
- 7. The AGENCY will not store, allow the storage of or discharge of any radioactive, toxic, flammable, poisonous, explosive or other dangerous, hazardous materials, or waste on the said premises. In addition, the AGENCY will not permit objectionable smoke, fumes, vapors, or odors to rise above the grade line of the trunkline. No signs, displays or devices may be erected on the right-of-way for the PROJECT unless specified herein or approved by the DEPARTMENT.
- 8. It is expressly understood and agreed that in case of non-performance of any of the covenants herein made by the AGENCY and after said AGENCY has been furnished written notice of same by the DEPARTMENT and has been granted a reasonable period of time as determined by the DEPARTMENT for performance or correction thereof, this contract shall be terminated and said AGENCY shall lose and be barred from all rights, remedies, and actions both at law and in equity upon or under this contract.
- 9. It is expressly understood that use of the trunkline and railroad right-of-way is subject to the paramount right of the DEPARTMENT and that upon a determination by the DEPARTMENT that such right-of-way is required for the construction, operation, and/or maintenance of any present or proposed trunkline and railroad or trunkline and railroad use, this contract may be terminated at the discretion of the DEPARTMENT.
- 10. Upon expiration or termination of this contract, the AGENCY will peacefully yield up said PROJECT and railroad right-of-way in as good order and condition as when delivered to the AGENCY at no cost to the DEPARTMENT. In the event this contract is terminated or expires and if the DEPARTMENT deems it necessary to request the removal of any facility occupying the premises, such removal shall be accomplished by the AGENCY in a

manner as prescribed by the DEPARTMENT, at no cost to the DEPARTMENT or the Federal Highway Administration.

- 11. The AGENCY recognizes and acknowledges that private and/or public utility companies may require the modification of the AGENCY'S facilities and it shall so coordinate the same when requested by the DEPARTMENT at no cost to the DEPARTMENT, or interference with the trunkline and railroad right of way and trunkline and railroad facility.
- 12. It is understood that if the AGENCY discontinues, abandons or changes the usage of the PROJECT right-of-way, other than as a non-motorized pedestrian facility, then this contract shall be terminated and the DEPARTMENT shall have the right to immediately reenter and take possession of said right-of-way.
- 13. In addition to any protection afforded by a policy of insurance, the AGENCY agrees to indemnify and save harmless the State of Michigan, the Michigan State Transportation Commission, the DEPARTMENT, the Indiana Northeastern Railroad and all officers, agents, and employees thereof:
 - A. From any and all claims by persons, firms, or corporations for labor, materials, supplies or services provided to the AGENCY in connection with the contract which the AGENCY shall perform under the terms of this contract; and
 - B. From any and all claims for injuries to, or death of, any and all persons, for loss of or damage to property, environmental damage, degradation, response and cleanup costs, and attorney fees or other related costs, arising out of, under, or by reason of this Contract, including the design of the PROJECT, except claims resulting from the sole negligence or willful acts or omissions of said indemnitee, its agents or employees.

The DEPARTMENT shall not be subject to any obligations or liabilities by contractors of the AGENCY or their subcontractors or any other person not a party to this contract without its specific consent and notwithstanding its concurrence in or approval of the award of any contract or subcontract or the solicitation thereof.

It is expressly understood and agreed that the AGENCY shall take no action or conduct which arises either directly or indirectly out of its obligations, responsibilities, and duties under this contract, which results in claims being asserted against or judgments being imposed against the State of Michigan, the DEPARTMENT, and/or the Michigan State Transportation Commission.

In the event that the same occurs, for the purpose of this contract it will be considered as a breach of this contract thereby giving the State of Michigan, the DEPARTMENT, and/or the

Michigan State Transportation Commission a right to seek and obtain any necessary relief or remedy, including but not by way of limitation, a judgment for money damages.

- 14. It is understood that the non-motrized pathway may need to be closed at the railroad crossing for up to a week due to railroad maintenance activities at the crossing.
- 15. In connection with the performance of PROJECT work under this contract the parties hereto (hereinafter in Appendix "A" referred to as the "contractor") agree to comply with the State of Michigan provisions for "Prohibition of Discrimination in State Contracts", as set forth in Appendix A, attached hereto and made a part hereof. The parties further covenant that they will comply with the Civil Rights Acts of 1964, being P.L. 88-352, 78 Stat. 241, as amended, being Title 42 U.S.C. Sections 1971, 1975a-1975d, and 2000a-2000h-6 and the Regulations of the United States Department of Transportation (49 C.F.R. Part 21) issued pursuant to said Act, including Appendix "B", attached hereto and made a part hereof, and will require similar covenants on the part of any contractor or subcontractor employed in the performance of this contract.

16. This contract shall become binding on the parties hereto and of full force and effect upon the signing thereof by the duly authorized officials for the AGENCY and for the DEPARTMENT and upon the adoption of a resolution approving said contract and authorizing the signatures thereto of the respective officials of the AGENCY, a certified copy of which resolution shall be attached to this contract.

APPENDIX A PROHIBITION OF DISCRIMINATION IN STATE CONTRACTS

In connection with the performance of work under this contract; the contractor agrees as follows:

- 1. In accordance with Public Act 453 of 1976 (Elliott-Larsen Civil Rights Act), the contractor shall not discriminate against an employee or applicant for employment with respect to hire, tenure, treatment, terms, conditions, or privileges of employment or a matter directly or indirectly related to employment because of race, color, religion, national origin, age, sex, height, weight, or marital status. A breach of this covenant will be regarded as a material breach of this contract. Further, in accordance with Public Act 220 of 1976 (Persons with Disabilities Civil Rights Act), as amended by Public Act 478 of 1980, the contractor shall not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment with respect to hire, tenure, terms, conditions, or privileges of employment or a matter directly or indirectly related to employment because of a disability that is unrelated to the individual's ability to perform the duties of a particular job or position. A breach of the above covenants will be regarded as a material breach of this contract.
- 2. The contractor hereby agrees that any and all subcontracts to this contract, whereby a portion of the work set forth in this contract is to be performed, shall contain a covenant the same as hereinabove set forth in Section 1 of this Appendix.
- 3. The contractor will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants for employment and employees are treated without regard to their race, color, religion, national origin, age, sex, height, weight, marital status, or any disability that is unrelated to the individual's ability to perform the duties of a particular job or position. Such action shall include, but not be limited to, the following: employment; treatment; upgrading; demotion or transfer; recruitment; advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship.
- 4. The contractor shall, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, national origin, age, sex, height, weight, marital status, or disability that is unrelated to the individual's ability to perform the duties of a particular job or position.
- 5. The contractor or its collective bargaining representative shall send to each labor union or representative of workers with which the contractor has a collective bargaining contract or other contract or understanding a notice advising such labor union or workers' representative of the contractor's commitments under this Appendix.
- 6. The contractor shall comply with all relevant published rules, regulations, directives, and orders of the Michigan Civil Rights Commission that may be in effect prior to the taking of bids for any individual state project.

- 7. The contractor shall furnish and file compliance reports within such time and upon such forms as provided by the Michigan Civil Rights Commission; said forms may also elicit information as to the practices, policies, program, and employment statistics of each subcontractor, as well as the contractor itself, and said contractor shall permit access to the contractor's books, records, and accounts by the Michigan Civil Rights Commission and/or its agent for the purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance under this contract and relevant rules, regulations, and orders of the Michigan Civil Rights Commission.
- In the event that the Michigan Civil Rights Commission finds, after a hearing held 8. pursuant to its rules, that a contractor has not complied with the contractual obligations under this contract, the Michigan Civil Rights Commission may, as a part of its order based upon such findings, certify said findings to the State Administrative Board of the State of Michigan, which State Administrative Board may order the cancellation of the contract found to have been violated and/or declare the contractor ineligible for future contracts with the state and its political and civil subdivisions, departments, and officers, including the governing boards of institutions of higher education, until the contractor complies with said order of the Michigan Civil Rights Commission. Notice of said declaration of future ineligibility may be given to any or all of the persons with whom the contractor is declared ineligible to contract as a contracting party in future contracts. In any case before the Michigan Civil Rights Commission in which cancellation of an existing contract is a possibility, the contracting agency shall be notified of such possible remedy and shall be given the option by the Michigan Civil Rights Commission to participate in such proceedings.
- 9. The contractor shall include or incorporate by reference, the provisions of the foregoing paragraphs (1) through (8) in every subcontract or purchase order unless exempted by rules, regulations, or orders of the Michigan Civil Rights Commission; all subcontracts and purchase orders will also state that said provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or supplier.

APPENDIX B TITLE VI ASSURANCE

During the performance of this contract, the contractor, for itself, its assignees, and its successors in interest (hereinafter referred to as the "contractor"), agrees as follows:

- 1. <u>Compliance with Regulations</u>: For all federally assisted programs, the contractor shall comply with the nondiscrimination regulations set forth in 49 CFR Part 21, as may be amended from time to time (hereinafter referred to as the Regulations). Such Regulations are incorporated herein by reference and made a part of this contract.
- 2. <u>Nondiscrimination</u>: The contractor, with regard to the work performed under the contract, shall not discriminate on the grounds of race, color, sex, or national origin in the selection, retention, and treatment of subcontractors, including procurements of materials and leases of equipment. The contractor shall not participate either directly or indirectly in the discrimination prohibited by Section 21.5 of the Regulations, including employment practices, when the contractor covers a program set forth in Appendix B of the Regulations.
- 3. <u>Solicitation for Subcontracts, Including Procurements of Materials and Equipment</u>: All solicitations made by the contractor, either by competitive bidding or by negotiation for subcontract work, including procurement of materials or leases of equipment, must include a notification to each potential subcontractor or supplier of the contractor's obligations under the contract and the Regulations relative to nondiscrimination on the grounds of race, color, or national origin.
- 4. <u>Information and Reports</u>: The contractor shall provide all information and reports required by the Regulations or directives issued pursuant thereto and shall permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information, and facilities as may be determined to be pertinent by the Department or the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) in order to ascertain compliance with such Regulations or directives. If required information concerning the contractor is in the exclusive possession of another who fails or refuses to furnish the required information, the contractor shall certify to the Department or the USDOT, as appropriate, and shall set forth the efforts that it made to obtain the information.
- 5. <u>Sanctions for Noncompliance</u>: In the event of the contractor's noncompliance with the nondiscrimination provisions of this contract, the Department shall impose such contract sanctions as it or the USDOT may determine to be appropriate, including, but not limited to, the following:
 - a. Withholding payments to the contractor until the contractor complies; and/or
 - b. Canceling, terminating, or suspending the contract, in whole or in part.

6. <u>Incorporation of Provisions</u>: The contractor shall include the provisions of Sections (1) through (6) in every subcontract, including procurement of material and leases of equipment, unless exempt by the Regulations or directives issued pursuant thereto. The contractor shall take such action with respect to any subcontract or procurement as the Department or the USDOT may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions, including sanctions for non-compliance, provided, however, that in the event a contractor becomes involved in or is threatened with litigation from a subcontractor or supplier as a result of such direction, the contractor may request the Department to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the state. In addition, the contractor may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

VILLAGE OF JONESVILLE ORDINANCE NO. 204

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING YARD AND GARAGE SALES WITHIN THE VILLAGE OF JONESVILLE.

THE VILLAGE OF JONESVILLE ORDAINS:

Section 1. Purpose.

It is the purpose of this ordinance to regulate the operation of yard and garage sales in the Village of Jonesville for the purpose of minimizing increased traffic, noise, and nuisance of repeated sales of various types of personal property. Successive sales can detract from the tranquility and privacy of neighborhoods, public safety, welfare and prosperity of the village and its residents.

Section 2. Requirements; permit, frequency, time, manner, etc.

It shall be unlawful and punishable by municipal civil infraction for any person to expose for sale, offer for sale or sell personal property from residential land, except in the following manner:

- (a). Six (6) sales may be conducted from a residence within a calendar year, but not more than one per month.
- (b). A free permit must be obtained from the Village, permits allow the sale for no more than four (4) consecutive days.
- (c). Sales may run from 8:00 A.M. to 8:00 P.M.
- (d). No sign shall be placed on public property, within a public rightof-way, between the curb and sidewalk, on any tree, light pole, utility pole or in any location that obstructs the vision of any motorist. Any such sign will be removed without notice. Signs are to be removed immediately following the end of the sale.
- (e). Upon written application of the majority of residents of any block, the Village Council may authorize a block yard sale which will not be counted against an individual's permitted sales.
- (f). Restrictions of this ordinance may be waived by the Village Council for sales conducted by charitable organizations and community events.

Section 3. Violations; Declaration of Nuisance.

Any yard or garage sale operated in violation of this ordinance is hereby declared to be a nuisance per se.

Section 4. Penalty.

Whoever violates any provision of this ordinance is responsible for a municipal civil infraction, and shall be subject to the payment of a civil fine of not less than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) or in accordance with the current civil fine schedule, which

ever is greater, plus costs and other sanctions for each infraction. Each day that a violation exists or continues shall constitute a separate and additional violation.

Section 5. Publication and Effective Date.

This ordinance shall be in force and in effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in a newspaper of general circulation within the Village.

OPERATION & MAINTENANCE

The plant was in compliance with the NPDES permit limitations during the month of April 2016.

Lagoon analysis was performed for Merry Lake, Lake Diane, Reading, Camden, North Adams, and Quincy.

RS Technical was on site to help us with a radio communication issue. The radio at the iron removal plant was not functioning properly. We used on of the used radios that we purchased last year. New radios for this application are no longer available.

The NPDES renewal application was submitted to the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality. It had to be submitted via the new DEQ website MiWaters. It was very confusing. Many thanks to Lenore for her patience with me during the process.

The first quarter drinking water analysis invoices were prepared and submitted to City Hall. The total amount invoiced was \$2,240.00. Another \$260.00 in walk in business was also submitted.

We started power washing a lot of the concrete on the plant site that was beginning to look pretty dingy.

PLANT EFFICIENCY—April 2016

5-Day Biochemical Oxygen Demand

NPDES Permit Limit in April 2016—25 mg/l Monthly Average

The BOD-5 test tells us how much of the oxygen in the water is being used up or demanded by the waste in the water. High oxygen demand will deplete the oxygen in the receiving water. This will have adverse effects on the quality of life (fish) in the receiving stream.

Jonesville Monthly Average—2.4 mg/l Average Percent Removal from the Raw Wastewater—98.7%

Total Suspended Solids

NPDES Permit Limit in April 2016—30 mg/l Monthly Average

Suspended solids are very important in controlling the process in the plant. Suspended solids are removed via settling clarifiers and are pumped to the anaerobic digester for treatment. The digested biosolids are applied to farmland at agronomic rates as fertilizer.

Jonesville Monthly Average—1.9 mg/l

Average Percent Removal from the Raw Wastewater—97.1%

Total Phosphorus

NPDES Permit Limit in April 2016—1 mg/l Monthly Average

Phosphorus is a nutrient that promotes growth. In fact, farmers use phosphorus as a fertilizer on crop lands. Phosphorus is found in many cleaning agents and industrial processes. Excessive phosphorus in wastewater promotes the excessive growth of micro and macro-organisms in the receiving stream. In other words, phosphorus promotes excessive growth of algae and seaweed. These plants demand oxygen from the water and tend to decrease the quality of life in the receiving stream.

Jonesville Monthly Average—0.6 mg/l Average Percent Removal from the Raw Wastewater—83.9%

Ammonia Nitrogen

NPDES Permit Limit in April 2016—Report Only

Ammonia Nitrogen is the result of bacterial decomposition of organic nitrogen. Examples of organic nitrogen include animal and plant protein, amino acids and urea from urine. Ammonia nitrogen is a very unstable form of nitrogen. In wastewater plants ammonia nitrogen is oxidized to form nitrite nitrogen. Further oxidation of nitrite nitrogen will form the stable compound called nitrate nitrogen. This process is called nitrification and occurs in the trickling filter towers. If nitrification does not occur in the treatment plant, it will occur in the receiving stream once again depriving oxygen from the aquatic population. Because of the sensitive nature of the microorganisms involved in the nitrification process, the ammonia nitrogen limits are about the hardest to hit.
