17th Annual Residential Spring Clean Up!





2023 RESIDENTIAL SPRING CLEAN UP ACCEPTABLE/UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

ACCEPTABLE:

- All bagged and containerized municipal solid waste.
- Bags and containers must weigh less than 50 lbs.
- Larger items such as: Carpet (4ft rolls), Padding (4ft rolls), Furniture, mattresses, box springs, toys, bicycles, home fixtures, and any other items as long as they are considered non-hazardous and can be safely lifted by two people.
- **We are not allowed to unload vehicles or trailers. Check with the municipality to see if there is a limit to how much material can be put out.**

UNACCEPTABLE:

- Small loose items. Must be a bulk item or in a bag or box/container for collection. Boxes must weigh less than 50 pounds to be serviced.
- Latex Paints – accepted at our Transfer Station only. Paint must be dried up in containers. (add sawdust, kitty litter or just leave the paint can open for a few days to dry out the contents. The contents must be solid and dry to be taken.
- Large Plastic Drums/Burn Barrels
- Concrete
- Large pieces of Metal
- Metal appliances – must call our office in advance to schedule a special pick up.
- Yard Waste
- Liquid Waste or Hazardous Waste
- Tires – accepted at our Transfer Station only.
- Non-latex Paints & Varnishes
- Motor Oil & Solvents
- Batteries
- Regulated Medical Wastes
- Construction Materials. (i.e. Flooring, Cabinets, Shingles, Siding, Wood, Bricks, Blocks & Pallets)
- Appliances that contain Freon, such as Refrigerators & Air Conditioners.
*These items can be accepted if the Freon is removed and the appliance is tagged by a licensed facility that the Freon is removed.
- Any additional items that are listed by the Michigan DEQ as banned from Michigan Landfills.
