

**CITY OF JONESVILLE
PLANNING COMMISSION
Minutes of June 14, 2017**

A City of Jonesville Planning Commission meeting was held on Wednesday, June 14, 2017 at the Jonesville City Hall. Chair Mike Venturini called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Present: Mike Venturini, Jerry Drake, Jim Ackerson, Christine Bowman, Charles Crouch, and Lance Taylor.

Absent: Annette Sands.

Also present: Manager Jeff Gray.

Lance Taylor led the Pledge of Allegiance, followed by a moment of silence.

There were no public comments.

Motion by Jerry Drake, second by Lance Taylor, to approve the agenda, as presented. All in favor. Motion carried.

Motion by Christine Bowman, second by Charles Crouch, to approve the May 10, 2017 meeting minutes. All in favor. Motion carried.

Manager Gray reviewed the 5-year Capital Improvement Plan, noting that the Plan is set for adoption with the pending Fiscal Year 2017-18 budget that will take effect on July 1, 2017. Gray noted that the Plan is submitted to the Planning Commission so that they can review it in context to long range development planning that they are responsible. Gray noted the infrastructure projects that are planned. General Fund projects of note were also discussed, including the Master Plan update and parks planning.

Manager Gray provided information regarding a recent training that he attended recently in Morenci that was presented by Michigan State University Extension regarding the Medical Marijuana Facilities Licensing Act, PA 281 of 2016. Gray reviewed a handout, included in the Planning Commission packet, of the Powerpoint slides that were presented at the training. He highlighted the various State Acts that have been approved related to medical marijuana, the various licenses that may be issued locally, the fees and revenues that are projected related to licensed uses, the State Medical Marijuana Licensing Board, and some of the other pro/con resources that were presented.

Gray stated that the Act is written so that facilities may only be established in the City if an ordinance is adopted to permit them. No license can be pursued if an ordinance has not been adopted. It was the consensus of the Planning Commission that no action should be taken at this time to pursue a licensing ordinance.

Manager Gray provided an update regarding ongoing projects around the City.

There being no further business, Chair Venturini adjourned the meeting at 8:14 p.m.
