5. A. **Master Plan Amendment – Incorporate 2024-2028 Recreation Plan** Public Hearing: This is the time reserved on the agenda to hear public comments on the proposed amendment to the Master Plan to incorporate the recently adopted Recreation Plan. The draft Amended Master Plan is available on the City website at the following link; https://bit.lv/JV-MasterPlan-2024. If Planning Commissioners prefer a print copy of the plan, please contact staff and we will make sure that you get one.

Notice of the Public Hearing has been advertised via the Hillsdale Daily News and City website. In addition, comments were solicited from surrounding units of government and other utilities and agencies prior to the public hearing. As of this writing, no comments have been received.

Action on the Request: Following the public hearing and including any amendments that the Planning Commission deems warranted, it is recommended that the attached Resolution to recommend that the City Council approve the Master Plan Amendment be considered for action. Please refer to the attached Resolution, Public Hearing Notice, and Notice of Consideration of Amendments.

Recreation Plan Implementation 6. A.

[Discussion]

The Recreation Plan calls for finding partner organizations for the installation of Little Free Libraries in Carl Fast and Wright Street Parks. The Hillsdale Intermediate School District has reached out, as they have grant funds for this purpose and intend to provide a library for each park to expand their network throughout the County. The unit is illustrated in the attachment – it is the blue unit and is constructed of composite material for durability. City staff will complete the installation, which is expected to take place in late spring. The ISD has a volunteer base that supplies the Libraries with a selection of children's books. The units can also be used for exchange of books for young adults and adults, as well. Staff is grateful for the ISD's interest in the project and will be asking the City Council to approve the donation at their meeting on March 20th.

Staff has also taken advantage of the break in weather and have converted a storage area at the rear of a dugout at Wright Street Park to a picnic shelter. We also have salvaged a larger swing set from property acquired for Cemetery expansion and will replace the unit at Carl Fast Park this spring. We are pleased to be finding some low cost projects to implement immediately, while also developing our capital plan and budget for future improvements. Please refer to the attached information sheets regarding the ISD's *library network and the proposed unit.*






